***Student Eligibility for Spain Trips:***

**Participants must:**

- Complete coursework equivalent to two years of high school Spanish by June 2010.  
(Possible exceptions are considered only with a teacher recommendation detailing the student's exceptional language skills)
- Be between the ages of 15 and 18
- Complete all sections of ECI's Individualized Application Form  
(Application includes: basic contact information for students & families, student interests, student introduction letter for Host Family with pictures (as applicable), any pertinent medical information, and special requests)
- Have a valid passport, *and provide ECI with a copy no later than 1 month prior to departure*
- Receive a positive teacher recommendation (ECI provides the form)
- Be committed to speaking and improving their Spanish
- Be open to new experiences and unfamiliar cultures
- Sign and abide by ECI's Personal Responsibility Contract
- Be able to make responsible choices and act in a mature manner  
(ECI leaders chaperone conscientiously. However, participants cannot be supervised 24 hours a day, and we therefore request that any student needing constant supervision refrain from applying for our life-changing programs)

Edu-Culture International's primary goal is a true language and cultural immersion experience for each participant. Immersion provides the student with a unique intercultural perspective, as well as the absolute best possible way to strengthen their language skills.

We take great professional and personal pride in making ECI programs the best of their kind. From our global coordinators to our local leaders, you will find ECI staff to be experienced, dedicated, and qualified educational professionals who provide guidance and support throughout the program.

Our Spain programs are based in **Salamanca, Granada, Nerja, and San Sebastián**. We also offer a **Customized Total Immersion (CTI)** program. Each of our trips includes a different combination of the following components:

- ❖ **Spanish Classes**
- ❖ **Activities / Excursions**
- ❖ **Language School Homestay**
- ❖ **Dorm Housing**
- ❖ **Host Family Immersion**
- ❖ **Travel within Spain**
- ❖ **University Credit Option**

Students choose different programs and locations, each designed to meet various interests and educational needs. All groups are limited to thirty students with three full-time adults: one trip leader and two additional chaperones. Our adult / student ratio is ideal in terms of personal attention, cultural education, organization and safety.

All students are able to take advantage of varied housing opportunities that include: **Dorm Housing, Language School Homestay** (two students per Spanish family), and **Host Family Immersion** (almost always one student per Spanish family). *For additional information on housing options for each trip, please see Accommodations Section.*

We also incorporate **Language Partners** into our programs, whenever possible. Usually European university students, Language Partners work to enrich the Immersion Experience by providing ECI students with community integration opportunities and additional practice in conversational Spanish. Small groups of our students explore the town with their Language Partners, participating in various activities while discussing (in Spanish) an assortment of topics such as: entertainment, school, politics, travel, vacations, and sports.

Designed to be fun as well as challenging, ECI's programs provide students with an unforgettable and exhilarating once-in-a-lifetime experience. Participants gain a global perspective, strengthen their college applications, and create lasting global friendships through this individualized and unique international adventure.

## ***Spanish Classes***

The Edu-Culture International (ECI) commitment to high standards also extends to our choice of language schools. We always take great care in choosing schools that meet all of the ECI quality requirements. The location of each school and program town has been chosen for its learning standards, commitment to quality teaching, safety, cultural environment, and beauty.

### **Academia Mester**

**(Salamanca)**

Academia Mester, established in 1991, is a well-respected organization specializing in teaching Spanish to non-native speakers. All language teachers are native speakers, have degrees in modern languages, and have had wide-ranging and solid professional experience teaching Spanish as a foreign language. Academia Mester features:

- ❖ Centrally-located schools, comprised of buildings designed and equipped for teaching
- ❖ Spacious modern classrooms, reference libraries, assembly halls, and common rooms for study and meetings, most of which are air-conditioned
- ❖ Computer rooms with Internet access
- ❖ 10 students maximum per class

Students are grouped into levels based upon a placement test completed before leaving the US. There are four 50-minute classes each morning, Monday through Friday. In the first two classes (grammar), students study different grammatical structures and their practical applications. In the second two classes (conversation), students analyze vocabulary and colloquial expressions.

### **Escuela de Idiomas - Nerja**

**(Nerja Summer Study, Granada/Nerja Combo)**

Established in 1980, Escuela de Idiomas Nerja is a highly reputable language school specializing in teaching Spanish to non-native speakers. All language teachers are native speakers and have solid professional experience teaching Spanish as a foreign language. Escuela de Idiomas Nerja features:

- ❖ A range of educational resources, including a bookstore, library, multimedia room, and Internet terminals (small fee)
- ❖ An on-site café with a lounge and a beautiful Andalusian patio

These common areas and library are located at the school's cultural activity and communications center, just a two-minute walk from the main part of the school.

- ❖ 10 students maximum per class

Students are grouped into levels based upon a written placement test taken before leaving the US. The course is comprised of four 50-minute lessons per day. The school's teaching method is the result of experience gained over many years of teaching intensive Spanish. Special emphasis is placed on communication skills and the use of language in real-life situations. Participants have conversation classes, oral and written exercises, structured grammar, audio and video practice drills, and conversation sessions on topics such as Spanish and Latin American culture and civilization. In addition, there are practical exercises in reading, composition, and vocabulary.

## **Don Quijote – Granada**

**(Granada / Nerja Combo)**

Don Quijote, established in 1988, is today a well-respected international language school that specializes in teaching Spanish to foreigners. All language teachers are native speakers, have degrees in modern languages and have had wide-ranging and solid professional experience teaching Spanish as a foreign language. Don Quijote features:

- ❖ A centrally-located school designed with modern classrooms equipped for teaching
- ❖ A library and computer room with Internet access and a common room for study and meetings, all of which are air-conditioned
- ❖ A recreation room where you can watch TV or a video, listen to music, read books or newspapers, and play board games or darts
- ❖ 10 students maximum per class

Students are grouped into levels from complete beginners to advanced proficiency based on a placement test completed on the first morning at the school. Classes are from 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. with a 30 minute break from 10:45 - 11:15 each morning, Monday through Friday. Students study different grammatical structures and their practical applications along with conversational Spanish incorporating vocabulary and colloquial expressions.

## **Lacunza IH (International House) San Sebastián**

**(San Sebastián Summer Study)**

Lacunza IH San Sebastián, established in 1986, is a prestigious language school that specializes in teaching Spanish to non-native speakers. All language teachers are native Spanish speakers with university degrees in the teaching of Spanish. International House (IH) is a worldwide organization with one hundred and thirty language schools in thirty countries, with each affiliated school operating independently. Lacunza IH San Sebastián features:

- ❖ A range of educational resources, including:
  - A library & range of DVDs available to students
  - Computers with free Internet access and a free WIFI connection
- ❖ A fantastic location in the center of the city, only a fifteen-minute walk from the beach
- ❖ 12 students maximum per class

Students are grouped into levels from beginner to advanced proficiency based upon a placement test. Classes are Monday through Friday for two weeks. The course is comprised of three hours and forty-five minutes of class per day and is broken into three sessions. Grammar is the emphasis during the first session of each day, while conversation is the focus during the remaining two. Students discuss current events using newspaper articles, films, and documentaries.

### ***Language School Homestay***

The Language School Homestay portion of the programs refers to accommodation with locals in the program town during the weeks that classes take place. Most of these homestay households are within a fifteen-minute walk of the center of the program town and language school in Salamanca, Granada, and Nerja. In San Sebastián, all are within a twenty-minute walk or bus ride from the language school and the beach.

Some homes are made up of a father, a mother and (occasionally) children, but many are single-parent households. These Spanish-speaking families provide room and board and are carefully chosen for ECI by the language school to provide a safe environment for our students. Students from other countries often share a family with our ECI participants, adding to the international flavor of the homestay experience. Generally, we place two ECI students per home.

### ***Dorm Housing***

Centrally located, the dorms in Salamanca and San Sebastián are within easy reach of each town's language school. Because ECI chaperones live in the dorms and eat with the students, they are able to form close bonds and relationships of trust and mutual respect with the students. For many students, spending two weeks here with the rest of the group is a perfect introduction to Spanish language and culture prior to the one-week Host Family Immersion, which occurs during the third week of the trip.

### ***Host Family Immersion Week***

After two weeks of practicing their conversation skills during classes and enjoying a fantastic variety of hands-on activities with the ECI group, students are prepared for the opportunity to become immersed in language and culture during the **Host Family Immersion Week**.

**ECI Coordinators personally select immersion host families.** Students live with these families during the third week of the following programs: Salamanca 1, 2, 3, and San Sebastián Summer Study. Participants on the Granada/Nerja Combo choose between two options:

1. Spending the third week taking classes in Nerja and living with their Language School Homestay family (as discussed above)
2. Spending the third week living with an Immersion Host Family (No group activities and no classes)

*Please note: we currently have no Host Family Immersion Week option on our shorter Nerja Summer Study program.*

Immersion host families often (but not always) have a son or daughter of a similar age and are excited about sharing their homes and lives with an American teenager. ECI participants spend their time during that week interacting with the family, the family's children, and friends of the family. As a hallmark of ECI's Immersion Experience, students are generally placed one per home during the **Host Family Immersion Week**. This is an excellent opportunity to become truly immersed in Spanish daily life and language and to form lifelong friendships. The chaperone team is on-call twenty-four hours a day to assist students should they have a problem or concern.

These warm and friendly families open their homes to American teens because of their genuine desire to share their language and culture. They make every effort to incorporate our students into their lives, many times arranging day trips and excursions which only locals are otherwise able to experience.

ECI students write a personal letter during their application process with information about themselves and their families as well as their ambitions, hobbies, and interests. From these details, our Host Family Coordinators carefully match each student with an appropriate host family. They take into account any specific requests and try to match each student's interests with those of the family.

Throughout this week, there are no organized ECI activities or classes. This enables participants to immerse themselves completely in the Spanish way of life. **For many students, the host family immersion is one of the most enjoyable and rewarding parts of the trip!**

## ***Travel within Spain***

ECI's programs include between 3 – 8 days & nights of group travel to some of the most beautiful and culturally enriching places in Spain. We always choose high quality, centrally located hotels. Please find some of our destinations described below.

- **Madrid**, the grand capital city of Spain. Highlights include: Gran Via, Plaza de España, Plaza Mayor, Puerta del Sol (a busy square marking the geographical center of Spain), the Royal Palace, the world-renowned Prado museum, the Reina Sofia Art Museum, and the Parque de Retiro.
- **Granada**, in the foothills of the snowcapped Sierra Nevada mountain range. Highlights include: the richly ornamented open-air rooms of the Alhambra, the Generalife Palace's spectacular gardens, free time to explore this old city of romance and folklore.



- **Sevilla**, the beautiful capital of Andalucía. Highlights include: the impressive Plaza de España, Sevilla's imposing Gothic cathedral, La Giralda, the Alcázar, the colorful Barrio de Santa Cruz, experiencing a flamenco show.
- **Costa del Sol**, on the Mediterranean. Highlights include: free time relaxing on the beach, journeying to the Nerja caves, and enjoying the sea breezes.
- **Barcelona**, with its landmark buildings and world-class museums. Highlights include: Antoni Gaudí's famous cathedral, La Sagrada Família, La Rambla, Parque Güell, the Barri Gòtic (Gothic Quarter).

## ***University Credit Option***

ECI's University Credit Option, available on all programs (*except Nerja Summer Study and Customized Total Immersion*), is an invaluable asset in today's competitive realm of higher education.

- ❖ ECI's University Credit Option provides students the option to earn 3 semester units in Spanish through the University of Southern Mississippi.
- ❖ These credits are transferable to other universities & accepted by most accredited universities in the U.S.

**The university credit option is a great asset on a college application because it demonstrates the student's ability to complete university level course work as a high school student.** (Please note: the University Credit Option requires additional fees and some additional work on the part of the student.)

## **ECI's Program Towns in Spain:**

### ***Salamanca***

Named a *World Heritage City* by UNESCO, lively and fun Salamanca is a youthful Castilian town of 180,000 people, 30,000 of whom are university students. Filled with ambience and charm, the people speak the "purest Spanish in Spain," making it an extremely popular place for learning Spanish. Salamanca's center, Plaza Mayor, is a beautiful 18<sup>th</sup> century baroque square surrounded by wonderful shops, outdoor cafés, and honey-colored buildings. Salamanca is located in the southwest corner of the Castilla-León region, about 150 miles from Madrid, in the western part of Spain near Portugal. Its turreted palaces, Romanesque cathedrals, and historic colleges continue to attract students from all over the world.

### ***Granada***

Granada, with a population of 250,000, is an Andalusian city filled with beauty and folklore. Set in the foothills of the snowcapped Sierra Nevada Mountains in Southeastern Spain, Granada is home to the Alhambra, a series of palaces and gardens built in the 14<sup>th</sup> century, and one of the most brilliant jewels of Moorish architecture to be found anywhere in the world. This amazing compound of buildings, including the Generalife Palace with its glorious gardens and courtyard, overlooks the city below. The Albaicín is the old Arabic quarter located on the hill opposite the Alhambra. It is characterized by cobblestone streets and whitewashed houses. With countless beautiful squares, a lively atmosphere, and a large student population, Granada is a very popular destination for ECI students in Spain.

Its distinct Basque culture gives the city a flavor all of its own and makes it an ideal and unique location to study the Spanish language and culture.

## ***Meet and Greet Service***

ECI program participants have the choice of traveling roundtrip on one of our chaperoned flights or making their own separate flight plans.

Participants who make their own separate flight plans are also responsible for making their own arrangements to meet up with the chaperones and group, unless they choose our **Meet and Greet Service**, which carries an **additional fee of \$150 minimum per direction**.

With the Meet and Greet service, an ECI representative will meet your son or daughter at the airport or any other designated arrival place. Prior to your child's departure, ECI will provide you with all necessary contact information, phone numbers, and a detailed meeting place and time. Once we have met your child, we will take him/her to meet the main group. The Meet and Greet is also available for the return trip, and we highly recommend it in either direction if your child is not traveling with the group. Remember that airline schedules are always subject to change. Please contact ECI to discuss this option.

# ECI Customized Total Immersion

**July 1 – August 15 / Independent airfare / \$725 per week**

Two to three weeks living with an Immersion Host Family (No group activities, no classes)

## ***During ECI's Customized Total Immersion Program (CTI), students will:***

- ❖ ***Participate*** in the daily life of a Spanish family.
- ❖ ***Speak*** Spanish with the family.
- ❖ ***Take part*** in home-life including meals and family events.
- ❖ ***Enjoy*** excursions with the Host Family, many times to places only locals know about.
- ❖ ***See*** sights, meet friends, and enjoy Spanish culture all from the local perspective.
- ❖ ***Immerse*** themselves on an everyday basis in the Spanish language and culture.

## ***ECI custom-designed the CTI Program for high school students who:***

- Are at least 16 years old.
- Have completed a minimum of three years of high school Spanish by June 2010.  
(Two years of middle school Spanish is generally equivalent to one year of high school Spanish.)
- Are motivated, adventurous, and have an independent nature.
- Are serious about speaking only Spanish while in Spain.

## ***Who are the Immersion Host Families?***

ECI has developed an extensive network of coordinators in Spain who are committed to finding families and who look forward to sharing their lives with our students during the summer. ECI Host Family Coordinators work directly for us rather than for a language school. Host Families are usually comprised of a mother, a father, and children who are often of the same age as the visiting ECI teenager. Immersion Host Families host ECI students with the intention of sharing their daily lives, culture, homes and food. Families often take their ECI student on excursions, involve them in family events, and introduce them to friends and relatives. Many times, ECI students and Immersion Families create lifetime friendships.

# Application Procedure – 2010 Summer Programs

1. The fastest way to reserve your/ your child's space on the chosen program is to use our online option for application and payment. Go to [www.educulture.org](http://www.educulture.org) and click **How to Apply** link. Complete the **Preliminary Application Form** and pay the \$125 non-refundable application fee.

Alternatively, you may complete the application page found at the end of this packet and mail it with a \$125 check made payable to ECI.

2. Upon receipt of the initial application form and fee, your child will automatically be enrolled in our Medical Expense / Emergency Assistance Insurance at no extra cost to you.
3. **Instructions on how to log in and complete your child's application will be emailed to you once the initial online application is submitted.** Please ensure that you and your child complete all portions of Application, including Host Family Introduction Letter and photos.
4. Please ensure that your child's Teacher Recommendation Form is mailed back to ECI (either directly from teacher or from you). If a student is not accepted into our program based upon an unfavorable teacher recommendation form, payments made for Cancellation / Interruption Insurance will be refunded.
5. Ensure that you and your child carefully read and the **Personal Responsibility Contract**. Please mail a signed copy back to ECI.
6. Payment of \$1500 (deposit + Program Fee #2) will be due within two weeks of initial application.
7. We will confirm receipt of your deposit via email – plus a time-sensitive option to purchase **Trip Cancellation / Interruption Insurance** (Insurance Decision Form), a highly recommended way to protect your trip investment.
8. **Within 15 days**, we must receive written notification as to whether you accept or decline the Optional Trip Cancellation / Interruption or Cancel For Any Reason Insurance Plans and payment if you accept.
9. Program Fee #3 of \$1500 is due by Friday, March 5, 2010.
10. The balance is due by Friday, April 23, 2010.

- ❖ A comprehensive Orientation Meeting will take place for local families in the San Francisco Bay Area in May or early June. This will be an opportunity to meet other participants, ask questions, and receive additional materials & cultural information. Since almost 50% of our participants live in other areas of the country, all pre-departure information will also be available online in the secure student login area.

## ***Additional Payment Information – 2010 Summer Programs***

- ❖ The application fee of \$125 covers Medical Expense / Emergency Assistance Insurance. It also covers pre-departure orientation & educational materials. It is separate from the Total Program Fee and is non-refundable.
- ❖ All Program Fee payments will be deducted from the Total Program Fee. Please refer to **Application Procedure – 2010 Summer Programs** for an outline of due dates.
- ❖ It is the parent's responsibility to make sure all payments arrive at ECI's office by their due dates. Parents must assume responsibility for late payments due to mail delays or other unlikely circumstances. Students whose payments are not received on time may lose their place in the program or be subject to a late payment charge.
- ❖ Applications made 60 or fewer days prior to departure will be treated on an individual space-available basis. Full payment will be due at the time of application, and completed application materials will be due within one week.

### **Edu-Culture International (ECI) Refund Policy**

After airline tickets are purchased and paid in full to the airline by ECI on behalf of a student, they become the property of the student and their cost is non-refundable. That portion of the Program Fee, once this occurs, is not included in the following refund policy:

- Prior to December 5, 2009: All Program Fee payments less \$150
- Between December 5, 2009, and March 5, 2010: All Program Fee payments less \$500
- Between March 5, 2010, and June 4, 2010: All Program Fee payments less \$1200
- After June 4, 2010: No refund

**Cancellations must be received by ECI in writing by the above dates for refunds.**
